Registration Information

To register for the 2017 Rally, please print the online registration form, complete it, and mail it with payment as directed on the form.

The registration fee for the rally (1 rig - 2 people) is \$80. The registration rate for a rig with one person is \$70. The fee for additional people, 10 years old or older is \$15 each. Your pre-registration by May 30 would be very helpful in our planning efforts. Thanks.

Parking fee is \$30 per night for full hookups. Be sure to indicate 30 or 50 amp preference on form. The fee for dry camping is \$20 per night.

Early Bird fee is \$10 per rig which is the cost of a chicken dinner Tuesday evening, June 13. Be sure to include the night when calculating total camping fee.

RV parking will be available from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm on Early Bird day, and from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm during the rally. The RV Parking Crew will assign all parking spaces on a "first come, first serve" basis.

On-site registration will be available daily from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm starting on Wednesday, June 14.

Directions to CAM-PLEX

From I-90:

Exit 129 - Turn South onto Garner Lake Road. You will cross the rail road tracks at the intersection of Hwy 14-16. Continue through the intersection. CAM-PLEX will be on the East (left) side.

From Hwy 59:

Upon approaching Gillette you will pass the first lighted intersection which is Union Chapel Road. After Union Chapel Rd the next lighted intersection is Southern Drive. Turn right onto Southern Drive. CAM-PLEX is approximately 2 miles on the East Side. (Southern Drive becomes Garner Lake Road after the first intersection)

Check-in

When arriving in Gillette and the CAM-PLEX Multi-Events Facilities, watch for signs directing you to the check-in area. Our Wagonmaster and his team will direct you to your campsite. Once you are parked, please go to the Registration desk in Energy Hall to complete the registration process and pick up your information packet.

RV Parking Information

Reata RV Park is an all-grass camping area located adjacent to the Energy Building, the site for the rally activities. Dry campers will park in the Windmill RV Park. It has gravel sites and a handicap accessible restroom and shower facility. In the event of heavy rains prior to the rally, all parking will be moved to the Windmill RV Park.

A dump station is available at the northeast end of the Windmill campground for your convenience.

Big Lost Meadery Production, (inside Pizza Carrello building) 601 South Douglas Hwy – Wednesday, 9:00 – 11:00 – Please sign up at Information Table – Transportation will NOT be provided. See the process of making "mead" which is an alcoholic beverage created by fermenting honey with water, sometimes with various fruits, spices, grains, hops. Mead is available for purchase at the Big Lost Meadery, 106 South Gillette Avenue which is on the Historic Downtown Tour on Thursday at 12:30 pm.

Dry Fork Station – Thursday, 9:00 – 11:00 – Transportation will be provided – Please sign up for tour at Information Table. Located seven miles north of Gillette, Dry Fork Station is a modern coal-based power plant utilizing the most current technology in electric generation. The sub-bituminous coal from the nearby Dry Fork Mine fuels the plant via a conveyor system of approximately one mile in length. Completed in 2011, the Dry Fork Station has a capacity of 422 megawatts which is enough electricity for about 324,000 homes. Departure time for the tour will be posted at the information table at the Rally.

Eagle Butte Coal Mine Overlook – North on Hwy 59 about 7 miles (past airport)

Just a short drive north of Gillette gives the opportunity to watch the operation of the Eagle Butte Coal Mine. From the overlook you can see how coal is mined in the Powder River Basin. The overlook is surrounded by chain link fence on the left (west) side of the highway, with an observation deck, haul truck tire, loader bucket and petrified wood.

The Rockpile Museum features exhibits related to the history of Campbell County and northeast Wyoming. Hands-on activities throughout the exhibits and coal mining videos make for an enjoyable and informative experience for the whole family.

Your Safety

Emergency Procedures

In case of an emergency, please call 911 (If using a courtesy phone in the Energy Building, you must dial 9 then 911) and do the following:

- a. Give your name and location (CAM-PLEX), and the park you are in (Reata or Windmill).
- b. Turn on your vehicle lights, emergency flashers, and have a neighbor stand by to direct the emergency personnel to your location.

Severe Weather

- In the event of severe weather, those owning weather radios will be alerted if tuned to WNG-660 on 162.500 MHZ and Gillette area radio stations will also broadcast weather information at 1270am, 100.7fm and 106.1fm. The sirens will normally only go off if there is a Tornado Warning for the area that includes the CAM-PLEX grounds. Sirens will sound for 3 minutes. An all clear will NOT be sounded.
- 2. It is recommended that you secure awnings, flags, and other loose items around your rig any time you leave your rig as storms with strong winds can build quickly in this area.
- WARNING
 - a. If the WARNING occurs during the day and you are in the Energy Hall, you should move into hallways, smaller rooms, and if possible, seek shelter under furniture and fixtures.
 - b. If the WARNING occurs after hours, you should proceed to beneath the Morningside Park Grandstands.
 - c. If we are experiencing severe weather, the siren has NOT gone off, but you feel unsafe in your RV, then you may proceed to the Morningside Park Grandstands
- 4. In the event of severe weather, pets may be taken to the building but you must be prepared to accommodate their needs.

Security

The CAM-PLEX is patrolled by the Campbell County Sheriff's Department and is a very secure and a safe place. It is always best to take necessary precautions to protect your property. It is recommended that you keep vehicles, RV's, and RV compartments locked.
